SHORT BIOGRAPHIES OF THE PRESENTERS

Carolina Alves holds a PhD from the State University of Rio de Janeiro (PPCIS UERJ), a Master's in Social Sciences from the same program and a BA in Social Sciences from the State University of Rio de Janeiro (UERJ). Carolina works as a Documentation and Information Analyst at FGV's School of Social Sciences, where she coordinates the Personal Archives Program and organizes and manages historical documents. She is a member of the Women's Archives Network (RAM), a collaboration between FGV and the Institute of Brazilian Studies at the University of São Paulo (USP). She has worked in the fields of sociology of culture, memory, and documentation, with a focus on race, gender, power, and representation.

Bruno Barsanetti is an Assistant Professor in Economics at FGV's School of Economics and Finance (FGV EPGE). He received a Ph.D. in Economics from Northwestern University in 2020. Professor Barsanetti researches the economic geography of developing economies, frequently with the use of historical spatial data. He published in the Journal of Urban Economics and in the Journal of Economic Theory. Recent research projects examine the effects of the timing of gradual construction of railroads on city sizes, path dependence in the spatial distribution of agriculture, the labor market consequences of transit shutdowns, and the historical predictors of deforestation in the Amazon.

Luca Belli is Professor of Digital Governance and Regulation at Fundação Getulio Vargas (FGV) Law School, where he directs the Center for Technology and Society (CTS-FGV) and the CyberBRICS project. Luca is also editor of the International Data Privacy Law Journal, published by Oxford University Press. He is currently member of the Board of the Alliance for Affordable Internet and Director of the Latin-American edition of the Computers Privacy and Data Protection conference (CPDP LatAm). He is author of more than 50 publications and his works have been quoted by numerous media outlets, including The Economist, Financial Times, Forbes, Le Monde, BBC, China Today, The Beijing Review, The Hill, O Globo, Folha de São Paulo, El Pais, and La Stampa.

Felipe Buchbinder is a Senior Data Scientist at the Brazilian Development Bank's Center of Excellence in Data Science and a Professor at the Getulio Vargas Foundation (FGV). He holds a PhD in Business and Administration from FGV EBAPE and an Master's in Data Science from Duke University. In addition, he is certified by Amazon as an AWS Machine Learning Specialist and by IBM as an Artificial Intelligence Engineer. He was a Data Scientist at Red Hat's Global Finance Analytics team, in Raleigh (USA) and at Deloitte (Brazil). He also holds a bachelor's degree in Engineering by the Pontifical Catholic University of Rio de Janeiro (PUC-Rio), having earned a scholarship to pursue part of his studies at the INSA Lyon (France).

Janice Elisabeth Butler is originally specialized in communication science at the Universities of Fribourg (Switzerland) and Amsterdam (Netherlands), she investigated the effect of humor in political communication with the use of social network analysis and fine-tuned neural language models capable of not only recognizing the degree of humor in a text, but also the type of humor. Reflected in the inter-disciplinary nature of her thesis, her interests are wide-ranging spanning from political and communication science to psycholinguistics with application of the newest methods from computer science. Currently a PhD Student in the Department of Political and Social Science at the European University Institute her research is now focused on techniques to counter political misinformation, with automation utilizing AI techniques of language recognition and generation.

Lucas Cardieli is a doctoral researcher at the European University Institute (EUI) in Florence, Italy. In 2018, Lucas was awarded a grant from the Academy of Finland to complete a master's degree in Comparative, European, and International Laws (L.L.M.) and a Ph.D. research project in law at the EUI. His doctoral research lies at the crossroads of AI, robotics, and human rights. It focuses particularly on humanoid robots (as a distinct AI/robotic technology) and the potentially impacted human rights, e.g., the right to privacy. Lucas also holds a master's degree in international human rights law, a master's degree in sociology, and a bachelor's degree in international relations.

Ninna Carneiro has a Bachelor's degree in Social Sciences from the Universidade Federal do Rio de Janeiro (UFRJ) and a Master's in History from Fundação Getulio Vargas. She works as a Documentation and Information Analyst for the Audiovisual and Documentary Center, as well as the Oral History Program of the Fundação Getulio Vargas Center for Research and Documentation of Brazil's Contemporary History (FGV CPDOC). Her primary research interests include the preservation and dissemination of sound and audiovisual documents, oral history, and film documentary.

Flávio Codeço Coelho is a Biologist (Federal University of Rio de Janeiro, 1992), MSc in Biomedical Engineering (Federal University of Rio de Janeiro, 1995) and PhD in Quantitative Biology (The University of Texas at Arlington, 1999). He is currently associate professor of Mathematical Epidemiology at the School of Applied Mathematics at Fundação Getulio Vargas. Over the past 20 years, he has developed an active research career bridging the fields of epidemiology, applied mathematics, computer science and the digital humanities. His current research is global in scope being supported by grants from organizations such as the Wellcome Trust, The World Health Organization and The Global Fund.

Adelina Novaes e Cruz holds a BA in Social Sciences from the Federal University of Rio de Janeiro and a specialization in Documentary Film Production from FGV. She is a Senior Researcher at FGV's School of Social Sciences (CPDOC), where she works with the Personal Archives Program team to develop initiatives for organizing, preserving, and disseminating the personal papers of men and

women who have distinguished themselves in contemporary Brazilian History. She co-directs the Audiovisual and Documentary Center (NAD) and leads a multidisciplinary team dedicated to public outreach. She recently published "Back to Power: the correspondence of Getulio Vargas and his daughter Alzira" (in Portuguese) with FGV Press. Finally, Adelina is in charge of the FGV MBA in Documentary Film and was a founding member of the Women's Archives Network in 2020.

Ziliang Deng is Professor and Associate Dean at Renmin Business School, Renmin University of China. He obtained his PhD from the University of Nottingham, UK. His research has focused on international business strategies under uncertain environments such as digitalization and de-globalization. He serves as Associate Editor of Journal of International Management, Senior Editor of Asia Pacific Journal of Management, Member of Editorial Review Board of Journal of International Business Studies. His recent papers on digital platforms have been published by Journal of International Business Studies, Information & Management, Journal of Business Research, and International Business Review. Professor Deng was the recipients of Research Excellence Award by Renmin University of China, and Higher Education Excellence Award by Beijing Municipal Government.

Martina Francesca Ferracane is passionate about policy-making and technological innovation. She is a Research Fellow at the European University Institute, where she manages the Digital Trade Integration Project. Her research covers digital trade, data governance, and digital education. Martina founded and manages FabLab Western Sicily, a non-profit organization that brings creative digital education to Sicilian schools and she was listed in Forbes 30 Under 30 for her work with Oral3D, a start-up in the area of 3D printing and dentistry. For her work in these areas, she was listed in 2018 among the 15 most influential Italian women on digital issues. She acts regularly as a consultant for several institutions including the United Nations, the World Economic Forum, and the World Bank.

Yuna Fontoura is a Professor and Head of International Accreditation at FGV EBAPE. She teaches Corporate Sustainability, Government and International Institutions, and Qualitative

Methodology. She holds a PhD in Business Administration (FGV EBAPE and University of Essex, UK) and an MA in Public Administration (FGV EBAPE). Prof. Fontoura is now one of the Brazilian Academy of Management's sub-theme organizers for Anthropocene studies. She has published in top journals as Organization; Gender, Work & Organization (GWO); Journal of Rural Studies (JRS); The Critical Perspectives on International Business (CPOIB) and The Environment: Science and Policy for Sustainable Development. Finally, she has attended more than 25 international conferences and publishing in peer-reviewed papers/proceedings in Management, Organization Studies and Sustainability meetings.

Dennis Francis is a South African-based scholar and activist whose work engages with questions related to gender, sexualities and schooling. Dennis is a former Dean of Education and currently Professor of Sociology at Stellenbosch University, South Africa. Their research, located in the sociology of education, focuses on how educational structures, discourses and practices reproduce cisheteronormativity and social inequality in schools, and how these are also resisted and challenged. Their most recent books are *Troubling the Teaching and Learning of Gender and Sexuality Diversity in South African Education* (Queer Studies and Education – PalgraveMacmillan, 2017), *Queer Social Movements and Outreach Work in Schools: A Global Perspective* (Queer Studies and Education – PalgraveMacmillan, 2020), co-ed with Jon I Kjaran & Jukka Lehtonen and *Queer Activism in South African Education: Disrupting Cis(hetero)normativity in Schools* (Routledge Critical Studies in Gender and Sexuality, 2022).

Anna Giurickovic is a lawyer and a research fellow at Tor Vergata University of Rome. She received her PhD in Public Law from Sapienza Università di Roma and is Professor of Public Contract Law. She holds an Inter-university Master at Sapienza University, Tor Vergata University, Roma Tre University, Luiss University in Administrative Law (MIDA), with a thesis entitled “On legitimate expectation”.

Suemi Higuchi holds a PhD in Linguistics from PUC-Rio, working with Computational Linguistics, a Master in Information Science from Universidade Federal Fluminense (UFF), postgraduate (MBA)

in Business Management and Information Technology from FGV, and a Bachelor of History from UFF. She is one of the co-organizers of the 1st International Congress on Digital Humanities in Rio de Janeiro, HDRio2018.

Richard Weixing HU is a UM Development Foundation Distinguished Professor and Dean of Faculty of Social Sciences, University of Macau (UM). Before joining UM, he was Professor and Head, Department of Politics and Public Administration at University of Hong Kong. Professor Hu was a John M. Olin Fellow in National Security Studies at Harvard University, an IGCC Postdoc Fellow at University of California at San Diego, and a CNAPS Fellow at Brookings Institution. His research focuses on the evolution of international norms and international order, Asia-Pacific international relations, Chinese foreign policy and public policy. In his academic career, he has published six books and over 100 journal articles and book chapters. His latest publication is a coauthored book entitled *Contesting Revisionism: China, the United States, and the Transformation of International Order* (Oxford University Press, 2021).

Maria Kartuzova is a researcher, lecturer of Social Sciences, and expect to complete her PhD in summer 2023. She currently is a research assistant at the International laboratory for Applied Network Research at the National Research University Higher School of Economics, Russian Federation. Her research interests include e-labor markets, self-employment of older people groups in Russian speaking countries, ego networks of freelancers and entrepreneurs. Her primary goal in researching elder e-freelancers' networks is to assist them in surviving in the competitive algorithmic IT world of the sharing economy.

Carlos Ivan Simonsen Leal is the president of Fundação Getulio Vargas (FGV). He graduated in Civil Engineering but decided to pursue a career in academia, obtaining his degree in Mathematical Economics from the Institute of Pure and Applied Mathematics (Impa) in 1982. He earned his PhD

in Economics from Princeton University in 1986 and then began his activities as a professor at FGV's School of Economics (EPGE), where he taught topics such as Macroeconomics, Microeconomics, Public Finance and Finance. He worked as a consultant for Brazil's Central Bank and, at FGV, held the following positions: director of FGV Business, 1992-4; EPGE's Dean, 1994-7; and vice-president of FGV, 1997-2000. For his contributions to science and technology, in 2002 he was awarded the Grand Cross of the National Order of Scientific Merit by the Presidency of the Republic.

Ricardo Lopes Cardoso is a senior associate professor at FGV EBAPE, where he directs the M.Sc. and Ph.D. in Administration programs as well as the Applied Research Center in Accounting and Analytics (ARC-A&A). Behavioral accounting, government auditing, data analytics, and continuous auditing are among his research interests. Ricardo has worked as an accounting consultant for businesses and governments. He works for the World Bank as an independent consultant. In 2010, he worked at the International Financial Reporting Standards Foundation (IFRS Foundation) in London as an Academic Fellow-Education Initiative. He has written books and articles that have appeared in academic journals such as AAAJ, JPBFA, PMM, Research in Economics, Mathematics, PLOSOne, Frontiers in Psychology, RAP, ASAA, BAR, and BBR, among others.

João Maia is a sociologist and an associate professor at FGV's School of Social Sciences (FGV CPDOC). João is part of the editorial team of the journal Estudos Históricos and oversees the Professional Graduate Programs (Masters and Doctorate) in Cultural Assets and Social Projects at FGV. His main research interests are the history of sociology in the Global South, teaching sociology in higher education, and social theory. He is currently serving in the steering committee of the International Sociological Association's Research Committee on the History of Sociology (RC08) and on the advisory board of 'Decolonization and Social Worlds' series of Bristol University Press.

Obvious Mapiye holds an MSc in Sustainable Agriculture, a PhD in Agricultural Sciences both from Stellenbosch University, and a BSc in Agric economics from the University of Zimbabwe. He is currently a postdoctoral candidate in the Faculty of AgriSciences at Stellenbosch University. In January of 2022, he joined Innovus, Stellenbosch University's technology transfer division, as a

Translational Fellow. His work involves overseeing the development of a smartphone-based farm management database application system for improving the sustainability of smallholder farming systems in developing countries. Dr Mapiye, over the past decade, his research work has brought a strong perspective on the need for developing user-centric, data-driven, and impactful innovations for commercializing emerging farming systems. His agricultural research and development interests primarily focus on Sustainable Agriculture, rural development, and commercialization of AgriTech innovations.

He serves as the principal investigator of the ERC-funded project “Emerging Welfare” (emw.ku.edu.tr), the H2020 project Social Comquant (socialcomquant.ku.edu.tr) and most recently ERC-funded Politus Project. His work focuses on social welfare and social policy, social movements, political sociology, and computational social sciences. His projects have created two datasets on welfare (glow.ku.edu.tr) and protest movements (glocon.ku.edu.tr). The University of Michigan Press published his book, *The Politics of the Welfare State in Turkey* in May 2022. He is also a member of the Young Academy of Europe and an associate editor of the *European Review*. He holds a Ph.D. from the Department of Sociology at Johns Hopkins University (2012).
